## SPECIAL COVID-19 ANNOUNCEMENT FOR HHSR 2022

While U.S. vaccination rates are climbing, the COVID-19 virus and its variants are still present in our communities. HHSR reserves the right to update these requirements as is necessary to preserve the safety of our community.

To ensure the health of everyone, and those they may live with, we require every attendee adhere to the following:

- All attendees are <u>required</u> to be fully vaccinated and to provide proof of vaccine on arrival. Fully vaccinated is defined as two shots of Moderna or of Pfizer or one shot of J&J.
- Booster shots are not required, but are <u>strongly</u> encouraged. If you have received
  a booster, please bring that documentation as well. (This should be included on
  your vaccine card or vaccination records.)
- Please note: if you have not had at least one booster shot by the time of the event, you may be required to present a negative PCR test upon arrival. Participants will be required to provide their own PCR tests at their own cost.
- Upon arrival at the event, before you get to the registration table, you will be asked to present a government issued ID and either your original and unredacted COVID-19 vaccination card or a complete and unredacted copy of your vaccination records.
- <u>Failure to present ID and vaccination proof upon arrival will result in ejection from the park/event without refund.</u> (Note: we will not be making copies of any ID or vaccination cards; this is just to confirm correct records are provided.)
- Masks may be required indoors. We are watching park guidance and health information and will make updates as we get closer to the event.
- Please be mindful that we all have different risk tolerance; always ask before approaching another individual. If possible, please maintain at least a 6-foot distance when indoors and 3-foot distance when out-of-doors.

Please be aware that these guidelines are a moving target. Should we make any changes, HHSR will contact all registered participants via email. We thank you for your understanding at this time, and we sincerely hope that we can welcome everyone back to the park in the future.
